



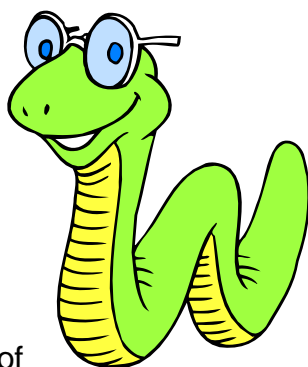

Educational Exhibit – 2013 is the 60th consecutive year that exhibits have been entered by our Grange in one or more local fairs. The first award, received in May, was the 8th annual Teacher Impact Award. Co-sponsored by WGAL-TV and Rotary Clubs, Krista was among five educators honored at a banquet held at the Sheraton Harrisburg-Hershey.



Krista was the driving force behind the Hunger Banquet co-sponsored last January by the Greenwood FFA and Perry Valley Grange. A report on that event was submitted to the Pennsylvania Association of Agricultural Educators *Ideas Unlimited Contest* and was selected as the curriculum to enter at the National Meeting in Las Vegas. The contest is designed to give members an opportunity to exchange classroom, leadership and other teaching ideas.



- Yes – The Grange will continue, albeit at some different location

The Grange is close to reaching an agreement with the Millerstown Community Park for our activities and events to be held in the community building there.

Recognition of Veterans Flag Day - June 14, 2013

As part of a nationwide program to recognize the sacrifices of men and women who have served in the United States armed forces, Perry Valley Grange No. 1804, Millerstown, honored local veterans at a special program on Flag Day, June 14, 2013. Certificates were presented to each of the 27 veterans present and those who served in World War II and the Korean War were individually given the opportunity to reminisce about their service experiences.
