School Essay-Poster Contest

"Ag Is Everywhere" is the theme of this year's elementary school essay and poster contest sponsored by Perry Valley Grange.

110 entries were received from students in the Newport and Greenwood Schools describing in their essay or showing in their poster the impact of agriculture in everyone's daily lives. Krista Pontius is chairing this year's project, again with help from Greenwood FFA students.

The number of entries for 2016 is as follows:

- Essays: 49 Newport, 12 Greenwood
- Posters: 0 Newport; 49 Greenwood

Our Grange will provide certificates to all participants and give \$400 in prizes for the top three entries in each contest in each school. An awards ceremony will be held as part of the Ag Day event on May 23rd at the Perry County Fairgrounds in Newport.

Ag Education Day

Monday, May 23, 2016

On the heels of the Grange's involvement with the "Meals of Hope project in February and the Newport Playground rehabilitation in April, this is a third big project for the year. Ag Education Day is a day of activities at the Perry County Fairgrounds in Newport for about 200 fourth grade students from the Newport and Greenwood Schools.

Some years ago the Greenwood FFA obtained a grant to do a similar program for local students and it was an outstanding success. Unfortunately, grants from other sources have been unavailable to help fund such an undertaking and Perry Valley Grange committed up to \$5,000 so this can happen again. Costs for such a large scale event include bus transportation for the students, substitute teacher fees, speaker honoraria, food and supplies.

Students will have the opportunity to attend several presentations and visit activity stations on agricultural and environmental themes. The goals include expanding student appreciation for the importance of agriculture and to encourage participation in the upcoming fair. An awards ceremony for the annual Grange sponsored essay & poster contests, this year on related themes, will be part of this special day.

This project will take lots of volunteers to greet arriving students, keep the activities running smoothly and provide snacks/bag lunches to all attendees. 
About 50 members and guests of enjoyed a bountiful fellowship dinner and the beautifully decorated tables.




