No way! An Executive Committee handles much of the Grange's routine business, so the monthly "meetings" take many different forms but none last longer than 2 hours. Some meetings consist of a fellowship dinner followed by a program or some special event like presenting the annual *Community Citizen Award*. Other meetings include a short business

session, a program, refreshments and perhaps the reception of new members. Sometimes we schedule an outing to tour a historical site or enjoy a meal together at a favorite local restaurant. Grange is for the whole family.
