Grange Makes Major \$\$ Commitment to Two Service Projects

Perry Valley Grange continues its active service to the larger community. Action has been taken recently to provide both volunteer manpower and major financial support for two big projects this year. A grant request will be prepared shortly and submitted to the Pennsylvania State Grange requesting the release of funds from the trust established upon the sale of our former Grange Hall and property.

Our Grange is partnering with the Greenwood FFA Chapter to sponsor a "Meals of Hope" food packing project in February. The goal is to raise \$12,500 that will underwrite the cost to package up to 50,000 nutritionally balanced meal kits for distribution to those in need throughout central Pennsylvania.

The effort is coordinated by a Florida based organization and is similar to a 2014 event at the Farm Show Building where local Grange and FFA members helped. Grange has committed up to \$6,000 to match, dollar for dollar, individual and community contributions for this project. The local coordinator of this event is FFA advisor and Grange vice president Krista Pontius.

The meal packing event will take place on Friday, February 5, 2016, from 5-9 p.m. in the Greenwood Elementary School and volunteers are needed to help. Snow date is Saturday, Feb. 6th. There will be two 2-hour shifts where volunteers will package food into individual kits. Grange members are also needed to help serve a light supper for all volunteers and/or to provide cookies (4-5 dozen) for a snack. If you are willing to help in any way, please contact Peg Bolton at 589-3897.

The second big project, also in partnership with the FFA, is an Ag & Environmental Activity Day in May 2016. Not all the details of this event are worked out and a final date has not been confirmed, but the preliminary plans include a day of activities at the Perry County Fairgrounds in Newport for about 200 fourth grade students from the Newport and Greenwood School Districts.

Some years ago the FFA obtained a grant to do a similar program for local students and it was an outstanding success. Unfortunately, grants from other sources have been unavailable to help fund such an undertaking and Perry Valley Grange is willing to commit up to \$5,000 so this can happen again. Costs for such a large scale event include bus transportation for the students, substitute teacher fees, speaker honoraria, food and supplies.

Students will have the opportunity to visit hands-on activity stations on agricultural and environmental themes and will be provided with a bag lunch. An awards ceremony for the annual Grange sponsored essay & poster contests, this year on related themes, will be part of this special day.







Dr. David Weaver- Zercher is a nationally renowned scholar of the Amish and Professor of American Religious History at Messiah College in Grantham, PA. Don't miss his outstanding program at our January 8th Grange meeting.

Dr. Weaver-Zercher will share with us a 30-minute presentation to answer the ten questions he is most often asked about Old Order Amish life. His commentary on the Amish has appeared in dozens of media outlets, including USA Today, Washington Post, Philadelphia Inquirer, Fox News, BBC Radio, and National Public Radio. His books include "The Amish in the American Imagination" (Johns Hopkins University Press, 2001); "Amish Grace: How Forgiveness Transcended Tragedy" (Jossey-Bass, 2007); and "The Amish Way: Patient Faith in a Perilous World" (Jossey-Bass, 2010).
