Doug Bonsall (standing) reported on the recent State Grange session held in Shippensburg. He and President Linda Byers attended the convention as Perry Valley's voting delegates. Carl Landis and Barbara McMillen (seated) review reports and resolutions acted upon at this meeting.

A special meeting of the State Grange will be held Saturday, January 28, 2017, starting at 1:30 p.m. in the Logan Grange Hall, Pleasant Gap, PA. The purpose of this special session is to act upon the 2017-2018 budget that was tabled/referred back to committee in Shippensburg.

Perry County will be celebrating its 200th anniversary in 2020. A Bicentennial Committee has formed and is already making plans to mark this milestone.



Mr. Glenn Holliman of Newport, chair of the Bicentennial Committee, was the guest speaker at our Grange meeting and explained that the celebration of this anniversary will be very different than the 150th celebration in 1970. The emphasis for the 200th birthday will focus on providing permanent reminders about significant places, events and people from Perry County history. Known as the Perry County Heritage Trail, a series of historical markers will be installed throughout the county to educate citizens and visitors.

Perry Valley Grange has committed to underwriting the approximate \$900 cost for one of these historical markers. The location and subject of that marker is not yet confirmed, but will likely highlight the significant contribution to rural community life made by the Grange.

Holiday Outing to Area Christkindl Market

A small but enthusiastic group of Grangers and friends braved a very cold and slightly snowy evening in December to visit the Christkindl Market in Mifflinburg. Known as one of the nation's best outdoor holiday markets, the streets of this small Union County town were aglow with lights, filled with pleasant aromas and alive with the sounds of Christmas.






Business Sponsor Recruitment Underway







Meet our January Speaker

The Rev. Sharron Riessinger Blezard will discuss the history and significance of the Protestant Reformation that started in Germany in 1517. She is an Assistant to the Bishop of the Lower Susquehanna Synod, Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and was called to his position in 2013 with primary responsibilities for communications and publications.

Rev. Blezard graduated from the University of Tennessee, has a Master of Arts degree in Professional Writing and later earned a Master of Divinity degree from the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg. Previously she taught English composition and remedial writing at the middle school, high school and college levels and later served as a parish pastor Pennsylvania, Tennessee, North Dakota and New York.
