# All of us are Part of the Problem & Part of the Solution

These are challenging times at Perry Valley Grange.....and from what I hear, for most volunteer organizations. It seems that nearly all groups struggle to recruit members who are really interested in their purpose and who are willing to work to achieve goals.

There's lots of lip service lauding praise for the many good works done by groups in the community and plenty of requests for these groups to contribute (financially and with volunteers) to all kinds of causes. All too frequently the initial enthusiasm for someone's pet project fades when that goal is accomplished.

If you are at all interested in the Grange, you know for the past two years we have been very proactive in addressing the realities we face. We've shared the issues and invited people to share their thoughts. We've challenged ourselves to "think outside the box" to find ways that our Grange can continue to serve others with the people resources we have.

In 1968, the following was written by Sister Marguerite Christman in her final report made as Lecturer of the PA State Grange announcing the failure to reach a state membership goal:

Harsh as these words might sound, it is nevertheless true that apathy, selfishness and lukewarm love of our Order are the reasons for this failure.

- Apathy "Oh, I can't be bothered, let the other fellow do it."
- Selfishness In not wanting to ask others to become members and thus sharing with them the joy and fellowship of the family fraternity.
- Lack of pride in this rural family fraternity By failing to speak for it, by my making it secondary to interests far less worthwhile.

The Grange deserves only the best and we, its members, will cause its light to grow or to dim.

Strong words, huh?.....but as true today as they were 44 years ago. And, unfortunately, those words from one of our state's most respected leaders did not change the continued decline of membership, leadership and influence of the Grange across the state.

As much as I regret to say so, no words that I write are likely to make much difference in the value you place on the Grange. We've appealed to individual conscience, coaxed people to share responsibility and tried all kinds of gimmicks to get more involvement. If we members of the Grange are guilty of apathy, selfishness and lack of pride that makes us part of the problems we face.

But over and over throughout history challenges can be met by a dedicated, determined group of people who want to change things for the better. YOU can be part of the solution! Step forward today to make a difference!

### **Property Issues**

A small but energetic crew did a great deal of outside work in early June around the Grange property – cleaning the pavilion for summer use, powerwashing the building exteriors, and doing routine landscaping maintenance. Thanks to all who helped.

We have now engaged the services of a pest control company that will do periodic spraying around the exteriors of the Grange Hall and pavilion to keep the spider problem under control.

One (of the four) air conditioning units in the hall is not cooling properly and will almost certainly require replacement. This is the last of the original compressors installed in 1988 so it has provided good service for many years.

A local church has shown some interest in a possible purchase of the Grange property and has agreed to inform us with their intent by August 1<sup>st</sup>. The Executive Committee outlined a number of provisions, including the fact that any sale must allow all activities scheduled through the end of 2012 to be held in the hall. The proposal made to the church included a provision for "life tenancy" by the Grange, allowing our organization to hold a specified number of meetings and fund raising events in the facility each year.




In Loving Memory......Since our last newsletter, our fraternal circle has been broken twice. We regret to report the deaths of:




