Public Forum: Spotted Lanternfly Issue

Friday, March 13, 2020 – 6:30 p.m. Community Park Building, Millerstown



Pennsylvania is being invaded! An insect known as the Spotted Lanternfly, first confirmed in September 2014 in Berks County, threatens a significant negative impact to Pennsylvania's agricultural economy and natural resources. The Spotted Lanternfly epidemic will be discussed at a public forum sponsored by Perry Valley Grange on Friday, March 13, 2020, beginning at 6:30 p.m. in the Millerstown Community Park Building, 110 West Juniata Parkway. The public is encouraged to participate in this forum; refreshments will be served.

The Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, in cooperation with the Pennsylvania Game Commission, confirmed the first detection of this nonnative species in the United States and, realizing the negative consequences of its spread, issued a quarantine in November 2014 intended to restrict the movement of the Spotted Lanternfly. Despite efforts to contain its spread, the Spotted Lanternfly was recently detected in Dauphin County.

The Spotted Lantern fly is a plant hopper native to China, India and Vietnam. The insect is known to feed on more than 70 plant species, 25 of which are in Pennsylvania. In the U.S., the Spotted Lanternfly has the potential to greatly impact the viticulture (grape), tree fruit, plant nursery, and timber industries. This

pest poses a significant threat to Pennsylvania – at risk are the \$28 million grape, \$87 million apple, and \$19 million peach industries, as well as the state's hardwood industry which accounts for nearly \$17 billion in sales. Early detection is vital to the effective control of this pest.



Speaking at the March 13th forum will be Dr. Liz Bosak from the field and forage crop team for Penn State Extension. She will discuss this invasive insect's biology, scouting methods, and management options. Prior to joining the Penn State team, Dr. Bozak worked at the University of Wisconsin with cranberry growers using integrated pest management tactics and grain farmers with

herbicide resistance management strategies and cover crops. She is originally from Chester County, PA, and earned her Undergraduate Degree from Hampshire College in Organic Chemistry and Plant Science and her Ph.D. from Penn State in Entomology.






