

Goal: Pack 50,000 Meal Kits to Feed the Hungry Friday, March 1, 2019 – 5-9 p.m. Greenwood Elementary School, Millerstown



Remember this scene from 2016? This candid was taken at the first meal packing event jointly sponsored by Perry Valley Grange and the Greenwood FFA. That year we reached and exceeded the goal to raise \$12,000 that funded the packing of 46,000 meal kits. As this newsletter is being written on 2/23/2019, we're within a few dollars of raising the \$12,500 needed to pack 50,000 meals this year. All the meal kits will remain in the local area to fight hunger in Perry and Juniata Counties. Any additional funds will be contributed directly to local Food Banks. Volunteers are needed to work 2-hour shifts to help with packing and providing a light supper to all helpers.

Perry Valley Grange is celebrating its 100th anniversary in 2019 and is proud to have served its local community continuously for the past century.
Because the Grange values and encourages volunteerism, a special project for this anniversary will be the sponsorship of a program to both recognize individual volunteers and to provide financial support for local groups.

- Individuals who give 100 or more hours of volunteer, unpaid service between 3/1/2019-2/29/2020 to nonprofit civic, school (educational), religious, fraternal or veteran organizations in the Millerstown-Liverpool-Newport communities will be recognized as a *Grange Centennial Volunteer*.
- 2. Service may be given to any number of different organizations. Verification of volunteer service worked must be certified by an official of each organization to which the volunteer service was provided.
- Upon submission of the required documentation below, the individual receiving the Grange Centennial Volunteer recognition may designate one organization to receive a \$100 gift from Perry Valley Grange..
- 4. Grange Centennial Volunteers may qualify for no more than one cash award and the total number of awards will be limited to first 100 persons qualifying.



2019 Service Projects

Our Grange is submitting a request again this year to the State Grange requesting the release of funds from the trust account set up from the sale of our former property.
