

National Dairy Month acts as a reminder of the health benefits that dairy products provide. They contain essential nutrients — including calcium, potassium, vitamin D, and protein. They also reduce the risk of high blood pressure, osteoporosis, and certain cancers, while helping us to better manage our weight. Kick start each day with nutrient-rich dairy products and start your summer on a healthy note.

The Perry County Dairy Promotion Team will join us at the Grange meeting to celebrate the dairy industry, share some delicious recipes, and allow us to sample some delicious dairy products.

Fun Facts about Cows & Dairy Foods

The modern cow is descended from a now-extinct wild bovine called the <u>aurochs</u> (pronounced OR-ox). Humans domesticated the aurochs about 10,000 years ago, and have been consuming cows' milk ever since. The first cow in America arrived in the Jamestown colony in 1611 and, until the 1850s, nearly every family had its own cow. So for June Dairy Month, let's celebrate the dairy cow and the products made from her milk with some fun dairy facts!

Cow Facts

- The average dairy cow weighs about 1,400 lbs.
- Cows have 32 teeth, all of them on the bottom with a dental pad on top.
- Cows have an acute sense of smell, and can smell something up to six miles away.
- A cow eats 90–100 pounds of food and drinks about 35 gallons of water (the equivalent of a bathtub full) every day.
- A cow spends about 6 hours eating and 8 hours chewing its cud every day.
- A cow does not actually have four stomachs, but a single stomach with four compartments:
- Rumen The first part of the cow's stomach helps break down complex plant products like grass.
- Reticulum The food is then mixed with saliva to produce a cud, which the cow brings back up to her mouth to chew and break down further.
- Omasum Where all the water is absorbed out of the food.
- Abomasum Where the food is finally digested, as in a human stomach.
- A cow produces an average of 6.3 gallons of milk daily. That's more than 2,300 gallons each year and 350,000 glasses of milk in a lifetime.
- A cow is more valuable for its milk, cheese, butter and yogurt than for its beef.

Milk Facts

- U.S. dairy farms produce roughly 21 billion gallons of milk annually.
- All 50 states in the U.S. have dairy farms.

- Dairy farmers are paid by the hundredweight (100 pounds), not by the gallon. There are approximately 8.6 pounds of milk per gallon.
- 99 percent of all U.S. households purchase milk. The average American consumes almost 25 gallons of milk each year.
- About 72 percent of the calcium in the U.S. food supply comes from dairy foods.
- To get the amount of calcium in an 8-ounce glass of milk, you'd have to eat seven oranges or six slices of wheat bread.
- Fresh milk will stay fresher longer if you add a pinch of salt to each quart.

Facts about Cheese and Other Dairy Products

- The natural yellow color of butter comes mainly from the beta-carotene found in the grass cows eat.
- Americans eat more than 300,000 tons of yogurt per year.
- About 300 <u>varieties of cheese</u> are sold in the United States.
- The most popular cheese in America is <u>Cheddar</u>.
- Vanilla is America's favorite ice cream flavor.
- It takes about 50 licks to finish a single ice cream scoop.
- It takes 10 pounds of milk to make one pound of cheese.
- It takes 12 pounds of whole milk to make one gallon of ice cream.
- It takes 21.8 pounds of milk to make one pound of butter.








Meals will be prepared by Central Baptist Church in May and Reward United Methodist Church in June.



Krista Pontius Recognized for Teaching Excellence

.A Greenwood High School teacher and Perry Valley's own Krista Pontius has been named a national semi-finalist in the Top Teacher Search by a TV show "Live with Kelly (Ripa) and Ryan (Seacrest)".

Her students affectionately call her "KP," She is described as "compassionate," "selfless" and "fun." Krista has been teaching since 1997 after she earned her Bachelor's and Master's degrees in Agricultural and Extension Education from



Penn State College of Agriculture Sciences. Krista's nomination letter says she "has been the recipient of numerous awards for teaching and for her active role in her community."

Over the years she has helped her students win many awards at the regional, state, and national levels and aided her students in raising \$55,000 and packing 150,000 meals that were given or distributed to the local food banks. Krista even traveled to Haiti and worked in an orphanage helping the poor.

The top four will be featured and the grand prize winner will receive \$10,000 plus an additional donor's choose gift card from Sonic to fund learning supplies for their classroom.
