In early September the "For Sale" signs went up on the Grange property but so far there has only been one showing. Realtor John Leidy reports that ours is a specialty property that may take some time to sell.



In accordance with requirements set forth by the State Grange, an appraisal of the property's value has been done and should be provided to us shortly. This document will be on file with the State Grange, the Executive Committee of which must give final approval for the terms of any sale.

Until a sale is completed, the Grange continues a full schedule of events at the Grange Hall and needs everyone's fullest cooperation and support.

A sub-committee (Krista Pontius, Peg Bolton and Doug Bonsall) appointed by the President will be meeting with the Millerstown Recreation Association in November for some preliminary talk about the possibility of the Grange meeting and holding other activities at the community building at the Millerstown Park.

About a dozen members and friends of the Grange gathered to help St. John (Barner's) Lutheran Church "schnitz" (slice) apples for the next day's Apple Butter Boil. This was the 61st annual boil and dinner, proceeds of which support many charitable causes.

Banquets & Public Dinners

As the news about a possible sale of the Grange Hall spreads, we have noticed a lesser number of banquets being booked. Although we assure callers that we can guarantee availability for at least 60 days, most groups want a longer commitment when planning their meal event. The result of fewer meals is decreased income while expenses to maintain our property continue.

Financial necessity requires us to plan for public dinners even as we are finding it increasingly difficult to find sufficient leadership and help. **The annual PA Dutch Dinner will be held Saturday, November 10, 2012.** Preparation will take place on Friday, Nov. 9th and all day Saturday. Your help is very much needed so please volunteer; donations of baked goods for the sale table are also requested.

The New Year's Day Pork & Homemade Sauerkraut Dinner will be served Tuesday, January 1, 2013.

2013 Grange Dues Now Payable

Lodge Moving Back to Newport

For the past two years, the Newport Masonic Lodge and the Royal Arch Chapter have met in the Grange Hall and some of their members have helped the Grange with fund raising and property maintenance. During that time a Joint Operating Committee was formed with representation from the Lodge and the Grange to plan these joint activities. A Joint Operating (bank) Account was set up to handle the income from fund raisers and the costs of supplies/property expenses.

With the pending sale of the Grange Hall, the Lodge has accepted an offer to move back to Newport in a rented facility just off North Fourth Street. We will miss their use of our building which, unfortunately, sits vacant on far too many days. Several Lodge members have said they will continue to help with dinners and property maintenance as their time permits.

The Joint Operating Account is being merged back into the Grange treasury since our agreement with the Lodge specified that all funds remained the property of the Grange.


